Fostering Advancement and Careers through Enrichment Training in Science (FACETS)

Fostering Advancement & Careers through Enrichment Training in Science (FACETS) is a six-week, interdisciplinary, research-intensive summer program hosted by The Office of Diversity and Inclusion within the Harvard T.H. Chan School of Public Health. FACETS offers a cadre of coursework, professional development, and networking opportunities to increase participants competitiveness for graduate school admission.

Summer Program in Biological Sciences

This intensive 8-week laboratory-based biological research program is for undergraduate students entering their junior or senior year in college. Interns apply state-of-the-art technology in their own research projects under the direction of a Harvard faculty member.

Summer Program in Biostatistics and Computational Biology

This six-week program introduces undergraduates to biostatistics, epidemiology, and public health research, with a focus on quantitative methods.
