


We offer two types of **Employer Information Sessions**:

Columbia's Pre-College Program has served high-achieving high school students from across the country and around the world for over 30 years.

The Opportunity

During the summer, we offer over 100, non-credit courses, both on our New York City campus and online. On campus courses are either 3 weeks or 1 week in duration. Online courses are either 2 weeks or 1 week in duration.

Our instructors are experts in their fields and have a passion and demonstrated aptitude for teaching.

The Curriculum

Instructors submit a syllabus before the program begins. Instructors may design the course based on their own expertise, as long as it continues to align with the course description.

To supplement lectures and classroom activities, instructors are permitted to schedule guest speakers, and for those teaching on-campus, arrange field trips to relevant locations nearby.

The Hiring Process

The hiring process for instructors requires one or more interviews, the submission of teaching evaluations, an online teaching demonstration, and other criteria.

All instructors must complete a mandatory background check and Protection of Minors training, as mandated by University Policy.
