LAW SCHOOL TIMELINE

This timeline is intended only to provide a general overview of the timing of the law school admissions cycle and should only be used as a general guideline of important items to take into consideration when applying to law school programs. It is strongly encouraged to meet with a Knowlton Center Career Coach to discuss and plan for law school.

1+ YEARS BEFORE APPLYING TO LAW SCHOOL	
FALL	 Investigate different areas of law and legal careers Browse/research programs and law schools For a list of ABA approved US law schools, see the Law School Admission Council's (LSAC) website, <u>www.lsac.org</u> Research the law school application process, <u>www.lsac.org</u>
LATE WINTER & SPRING	 Decide when to take the LSAT (June or July) 1+ years before appling, or in September or October the year you apply Register for the LSAT if taking the test in June or July If taking the LSAT in June or July, study for the LSAT and take many practice tests Free LSAT preparation and practice tests provided by Khan Academy, available through LSAC: <u>www.lsac.org</u> Create a list of faculty members that you would like to ask to write your recommendation letters
SUMMER	 Create your lsac.org account Register for the Credential Assembly Service (CAS) through <u>www.lsac.org</u> Details about the CAS are provided through <u>www.lsac.org</u> If registered, take the LSAT in June/July Request information from and plan visits to law schools Create a list of law schools to which you plan to apply Create a list/spreadsheet of specific deadlines and application requirements for each law school Begin development of your application materials Register for the LSAT if taking the test in September or October If taking the LSAT in September or October, study for the LSAT and take many practice tests
DURRING THE YEAR OF APPLYING TO LAW SCHOOL	
FALL	 If you have not already done so, create your lsac.org account, and register for the CAS If registered, take the September/October LSAT Continue development of your application materials and have those materials, including your <i>personal statement</i>, reviewed by a Knowlton Center Career Coach Request letters of recommendation and transcript to be sent to CAS Ensure that your LSAT score has been reported to CAS Request financial aid information Finalize and send in completed law school applications by end of the year if possible
WINTER	 If you have not already done so, finalize and send in completed law school applications as early in the year as possible Send your updated transcript to CAS and the law schools to which you have applied Send this right away, especially if your GPA continues to be high or continues to improve Prepare for interviews if offered by the law schools Submit financial aid forms
SPRING	 Evaluate offers of acceptance and financial aid Submit acceptance letter to law school of your choice Share where you have been accepted and your future plans with faculty and the Knowlton Center
