

Additional Funding Opportunities

The following funding opportunities are available as part of the Denison Internship Program. These funds have their own unique requirements. When applying for a stipend as part of the Denison Internship Program you can select to be considered for one of these funds. The funds are not in addition to general stipend funds.

CROWN FELLOWSHIP

Through the generosity of alumna Janet Crown (Denison Class of 1985 and a member of the Board of Trustees), the Knowlton Center is able to offer students the opportunity to receive funding for a summer internship as part of the Crown Fellowship. All students are eligible for this \$5000 stipend to help offset the cost of a summer internship, regardless of financial need level.

When filling out the internship program application, select "Yes" to the Crown Fellowship question in order to be considered and submit a 250-300 word essay in which you articulate the following:

- 1) How you have developed any three of the following traits during your time at Denison: tenacity, drive, sociability, strong moral compass, entrepreneurial skills and a concern for community?
- 2) How your upcoming internship might allow you to leverage or further develop these traits?

Crown Fellowship application closes on May 1st. In addition to the stipend funding requirements, all students who receive the Crown Award may be invited to a meeting in early Fall with Janet Crown '85 to share reflections from their internship experience. If scheduled, this meeting is required for all Crown Fellow recipients.

MAKE NO LITTLE PLANS

The "Make No Little Plans" internship stipend is to support students who have big dreams of pursuing a career in the performance of popular music or in the music industry, broadly defined. A \$5,000 internship stipend will be awarded to one student per year to help offset the cost of a summer internship, regardless of financial need level. The stipend will be awarded to a student with a demonstrated passion for and commitment to exploring careers in the performance of popular music or the music industry, including the full spectrum of artistic, technical, and business, entrepreneurial, or managerial roles in the performing arts. Recipients do not need to be a music major or minor. Awards are not based on financial need and recipients may reapply in subsequent years.

When filling out the internship program application, select "Yes" to the Make No Little Plans question in order to be considered and submit a short essay (up to 3 paragraphs) in which you articulate the following:

- 1) Your background, plans, and dreams for a career in the music industry including a compelling articulation of your "big plan"
- 2) A description of the internship opportunity or experience and how it connects to your interests and plans
- 3) Information about your interest in and understanding of the music industry and your commitment to this plan.
