Pre-Dental Studies Designation AY20-21

The **Pre-Dental Studies Designation ("Pre-Dental Designation")** is designed for students who are planning on pursuing a DDS or DMD (not intended for students enrolled in QU's entry-level professional track programs such as PA or OT). The Pre-Dental Designation is <u>not a stand-alone program</u> - it is completed in addition to the student's undergraduate degree and major. Application to dental school may require coursework outside of a specific major. The Pre-Dental Designation allows students to enroll in and track typical dental school course requirements. While the Pre-Dental Designation will cover most standard pre-requisite courses, requirements vary by school. <u>Designation enrollees are responsible for checking their intended dental programs in advance of the AADSAS application process to determine if additional coursework is required.</u>

To receive the Pre-Dental Studies Designation upon graduation, the following are required:

- a) Cumulative GPA of 3.3 or above in required Pre-Dental Designation courses
- b) Minimum of 18 credit hours of Pre-Dental Designation coursework must be completed at Quinnipiac

Grades received for courses taken at other universities may be utilized for transfer student GPA eligibility. Congruent with <u>American Dental Education Association</u> and dental school admissions policies, <u>grades will not be "replaced" for repeated coursework</u> to determine GPA eligibility and <u>online courses will not be accepted</u>.

In addition to strong academic performance, Pre-Dental Designation enrollees must actively pursue opportunities throughout their undergraduate years to gain exposure to dentistry and experience with patient interaction. A wide range of skills and competencies should be developed through the following:

- extended exposure to healthcare and dentistry (shadowing, clinical work, volunteering, etc.),
- research outside of the curriculum,
- substantial volunteer efforts and community involvement,
- leadership experiences,
