First Year Seminar Requirement	Choose a section of FYS101 with a topic that interests you. The particular topics that draw you in can also be a clue to majors you might like. NOTE: if you are in a Living Learning Community (LLC), you will be preregistered for a section of FYS that corresponds to the LLC.	FYS101	3
English*	When you completed the English placement process, you self-selected either EN 101 or EN 101I. If you have forgotten which you chose, look in Self-Service under Test Summary. A score of 3 = EN 101I; 4 = EN 101	EN101 or EN101I	3
Math*	Unless you are interested in exploring math as a major, you should <u>not</u> take math in your first semester. However, you still need to take your math placement test <u>now</u> .	None	0
