- Submit your resume and cover letter. The company will reach out to you for an interview or with next steps.

Add the micro-internship to your resume

- Unless given explicit permission from the company, do not list the company name.
 - o If this happens, list the company as "Parker Dewey"
- You are considered an "Independent Consultant", not an employee of the organization or Parker Dewey.

Reference the example below.

List your job title as "Independent Consultant"

Independent Consultant, Parker Dewey

List the company name as "Parker Dewey", unless the company gives you permission to use their name.

- Bullet point explaining the project you completed.
- Bullet point explaining the task and deliverable that you complete for the project.
