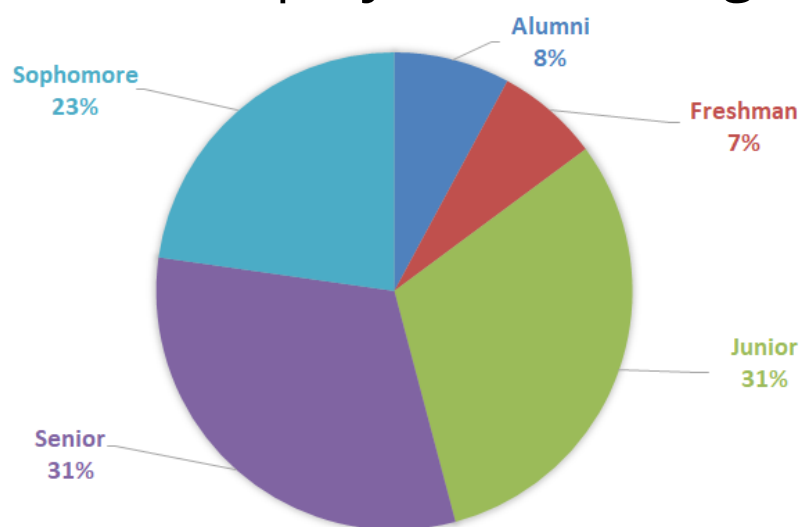


Finding Internships in Handshake¹

What is an internship?

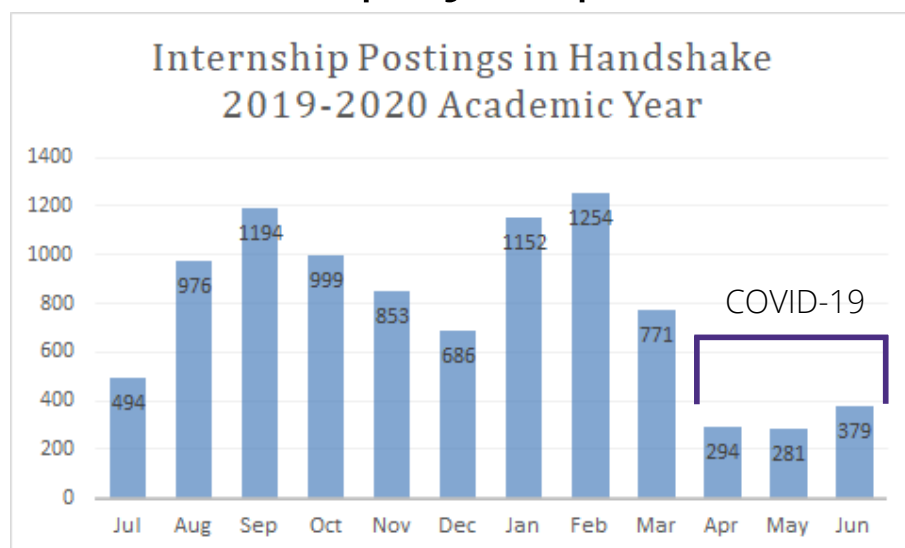
An internship is a form of experiential learning that allows students to apply their academic learning through hands-on experiences, develop or refine specific skills, and/or explore a specific industry or job sector.

Recruitment Timelines

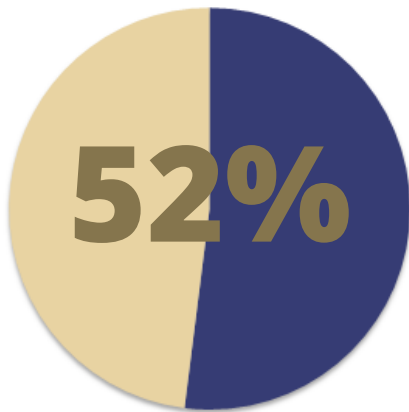
- Most industries do not have specific recruitment timelines
- The highest volume of summer internship postings are during winter quarter
- Some industries (e.g. accounting, consulting, engineering, and finance) recruit heavily in fall quarter
- Many employers do "just-in-time" hiring for summer and year-round internships

How early do employers post?

Summer Internships	Academic Year Internships
85% More than 2 months out	50%* More than 2 months out

Tips and Caveats

- Complete your Handshake profile! 80% of employers search for and contact students based on profiles.
- Use filters in Handshake to find relevant postings. Start with geographic region or opportunity type.
- Use 'Match Preferences' to find opportunities that line up with your profile.
- International students can filter by postings that accept CPT/OPT, will sponsor, and/or don't require US work visas
- Employers may not know UW-specific terminology so be creative with search keywords and criteria
- Be patient and inclusive! Check back with Handshake often - recruitment timelines are not 'one size fits all.'
- Many postings get less than 5 applications total from UW students. Be open to various opportunities and learn more about employers that are new to you.
- Not everything is in Handshake. We recommend asking your networks or going directly to employer websites.
