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

TAKEAWAY 1: STATE OF JOB MARKET






Interviewing Tips FROM STACEY CACERES, ENTERPRISE




Salary Negotiation Tips FROM MONIQUE MICHEL & SHERRI BRUUN, VERITAS TECHNOLOGIES

- Preparation is key so do your research ahead of time. What are your must-haves and what would you like, but can budge on if you have to.
- Don't lead with the salary question. First show interest in the role and company.
