For employers looking to recruit IU School of Public Health-Bloomington students, we are available to assist in a variety of ways to ensure you are meeting with the students who best match your job and internship openings.

Assist with recruiting – Our team works one-on-one with employers to understand their needs and ideal qualities in candidates for jobs and internships, and then helps to match employers with students in our school. We offer a variety of recruiting opportunities and work with employers to customize services.

Interviews – Employers are invited to set up interviews on-campus or virtually throughout the academic year. We work with employers to make dedicated space available for interviews and work to ensure you are able to meet and connect with the students you see as candidates for your open positions.

Career fairs – We host a fall and spring career fair each academic year and invite employers cutting across public health industries to participate in one or both of these opportunities. Our fairs draw students from all majors eager to discuss internship and full-time job opportunities. On occasion, we host events based on specific industries. Career fairs may also be held virtually offering both one-on-one and group interactions from a distance.

Other events – We are always looking for employers willing to interact with students and be part of panel discussions, networking events, employer office hours, and information sessions with our students. This is a great way for both students and employers to network, and allows students to learn more about a company, job, and field. Opportunities are also available in virtual formats.

Job/internship postings – Handshake is our free job and internship posting site available to all IU students. Employers may advertise approved job or internship postings here at no cost, and can determine the deadline and application method for each posting.

Partnership opportunities – We offer several ways employers can stand out among the crowd and partner with our office on events. We offer partnership opportunities for career fairs, career programs and workshops, and networking trips. In addition, our Employer Spotlight is a featured blog article written by the employer that gives an overview of the organization, showcases any alumni working there, and outlines any positions available.

The Office of Career Services at the IU School of Public Health-Bloomington is focused on ensuring our students and graduates are ready for a career in public health.
