GUIDELINES FOR STUDENT ORGANIZATION FUNDING PROPOSALS

Student organizations, and the events they create, play an important role in enhancing the college student experience. Student organizations can foster lifelong friendships and serve as the basis for a post-graduation professional network. Events created by student organizations offer members the opportunity to explore passions and interests, build community, network, and gain skills and knowledge. Participating in the planning and execution of these events provides valuable opportunities for leadership development, teamwork, and communication skills, which are essential for personal and professional growth.

We in the Feld Center are continually impressed by the time and energy students devote to creating programs, events, and opportunities for their peers. We are excited to support these efforts. While we wish we could grant all student organization requests for funding, we do have a finite budget for this type of support. Funds available are used to support events and initiatives aimed at improving career outcomes for Questrom students.

The guidelines used to evaluate student organization funding proposals received by the Feld Center are:

- Events that demonstrate career value will be considered.
- No funding will be provided to events that fail to demonstrate concrete and direct value to improved career outcomes.
- Events involving a single student organization and five or fewer alumni or industry partner attendees will receive a maximum of \$400.
- Events involving a single student organization and six or more alumni or industry partner attendees will receive a maximum of \$600.
- Events involving two or more student organizations and five or fewer alumni or industry partner attendees will receive a maximum of \$800.
- Events involving two or more student organizations and six or more alumni or industry partner attendees will receive a maximum of \$1000.
- Signature events with a demonstrable and significant impact on student career outcomes may be eligible for increased funding at the discretion of Feld Center leadership.
