• Facilitate discussion between the Student Body Congress and the Executive Branch regarding campus concerns

Greek Life Chapter

Vice President of Standards

 Formulate mediation and arbitration for all chapter misconduct hearings on a basis of alleged violations of the chapter code of conduct, supervising a council of 3 representative members for adjudicative purposes

Women in Government

Co-President

- Plan professional development and social events to educate and empower women to be involved in public service.
- Correspond with university staff and fellow student leaders to coordinate relevant speakers and develop engaging opportunities for students.

Director of Marketing

- Design social media content, informational graphics, and apparel to promote club fundraisers and events.
- Created monthly newsletter to advertise relevant programs and provide content recommendations.
