Direct Inquiries

In some cases, you may want or need to include direct inquiries as part of your job search strategy. Not all organizations welcome direct inquiries, but in the below situations you should use this method:

- If you know that you are interested in working for a hospital, clinic, or medical center, research the facilities in your area and make a list of the ones that interest you. For each one, first check to see if the position you're looking for is available in Handshake. If they've posted with Mercy College, you should apply through the College. If not, check the Careers section of their website for full time and part time employment, or their Volunteer page for volunteer and internship opportunities. Note that some hospitals will have administrative internships available for undergrads, but in most cases those kinds of opportunities will be included in their Volunteer program.
- ➤ If there are specific organizations that you're interested in working for, you should also go directly to their website and view the Careers or Jobs page to see if there are any positions available that match your interest. If not, consider inquiring with the HR department or submitting a cover letter and resume for the employer to keep on file.
- ➤ If you would like to work for a small doctor's office or similar practice, they may not have posted a position online. Consider calling or emailing their office directly to find out if they are looking for help in your area of interest.
- ➤ If you are currently working part-time or have previously worked for a company, you already have a professional connection. Talk to your supervisor to see if they offer any job opportunities in the company, or if they know of any in their industry.

Networking
