

Why do an internship?

- Try something out to better evaluate your field of interest
- Fulfill an academic requirement in your program
- Develop career competencies
- Build relationships and expand your professional network





Need an internship for academic requirement?

- Use the <u>Programs of Study</u> page or talk to your academic advisor to see if your major requires an internship and how many credits are required.
- If required, make sure to check in with your department to see what the requirements are for the type of internship you need.
- If an internship isn't required for your program, you may still get credit for your internship or do a 0-credit internship for transcript recognition.

For-Credit vs 0-Credit Internships

For-Credit Internship

- Coordinated between you, your faculty advisor, and your internship site supervisor
- Appears as a **letter grade** on your transcript
- Charged tuition for number of credits
- Course code is designated as your major
- Project oriented and less than 20% administrative

O-Credit Internship

- Coordinated between Career Development and your internship site supervisor
- Graded Pass/Fail, appears on your transcript
- Not charged tuition, but \$100 fee is required
- Designated as an Interdisciplinary course
- Project oriented and less than 20% administrative

Hour Requirements

Internships can be completed Summer, Fall, or Spring semesters

4 Credits	10-12 Hours	150-160 Hours	All Students
3 Credits	8-10 Hours	120 Hours	Fashion Students
2 Credits	5-6 Hours	75-80 Hours	All Students



Dear Julia Employer,



 - The set-up process can take a couple weeks




- Always be professional
