It provides a foundation for future job, internship, volunteer, and grad school pursuits. Slides 1 & 2:

1. Your name, major, and expected graduation date
 2. Your selected health profession (1 pt)
 3. Job description (3-5 sentences) (2 pts)

2. Activities

 - d. Education section (0.5 pts)
