Methodology

Career Services at the University of Pennsylvania annually surveys graduating students to provide a snapshot of their post-graduation plans.

This report looks at the 1,514 College of Arts and Sciences undergraduates who received their degrees from August 2021—May 2022. Students were surveyed up to six months from their graduation date, with a 55% response rate. Additional information was collected via LinkedIn and other sources, bringing the total **knowledge rate** up to **67%**, a total of 1,016 known graduate outcomes.



Known Outcomes 1,016 responses






Employment by Industry









Employment by Job Function









The primary method for obtaining the full-time employment offer that graduates accepted.


26% accepted return offers from a summer internship/previous employer, primarily in the **Financial Services** industry.


