

## **Resume: Objective**

An objective is not generally necessary but can be useful if there is a specific focus that highlights your most relevant strengths and qualifications.

## Example:

 A nursing position at a pediatric hospital that will build on previous experiences as a nurse extern, camp counselor, and childcare worker.



## **Resume: Experience**

- Feature your most relevant/related experience.
  - Clinical Experience
    - Within Clinical Rotations: List in a streamlined way, perhaps with more detail for particularly notable or relevant rotations. Focus on accomplishments and highlights.
    - *Outside of Clinical Rotations:* Externships, Volunteer Clinical Work, Nurse's Aide or related experience
  - Other Health Related Experience
    - Research Experience
    - Public/Community/International Health Experience
- Other experience can go in an "Additional Experience" section to showcase other important skills.

## **Checklist Exercise: Format**



## **BSN RESUME CHECKLIST**

### **FORMAT**

- ☐ Your margins are at least 0.65" on all sides and your font size is at least 10pt
- □ Your section headers are all spelled correctly (Spellcheck does not automatically check words in ALL CAPS)
- □ You have included your degree ("Candidate for Bachelor of Science in Nursing" for example)
- □ Your GPA is listed exactly as it appears in Penn-In-Touch (You must list all 3 digits. You may include your major/concentration GPA in addition to your cumulative if you list # of courses.)
- □ You have included cities and states for each experience in all sections, and formatted them consistently (Make sure locations are listed in the same place for each experience in every section, and use two-letter state abbreviations)
- □ All your experiences have dates including months or seasons and are formatted consistently. (Be especially mindful of alignment, spacing, how you abbreviate months, and dashes: – versus - )






# **Checklist Exercise: Organization**

## **ORGANIZATION**

- ☐ Your "Education" section is listed before your Experience section(s)
- ☐ You've strategically targeted your audience in your "Experience" sections when applicable (e.g. "Clinical Experience," "Research Experience", "Health-Related Experience", "Leadership and Activities")
- Your experiences are listed in reverse-chronological order (most recent at the top of each section)
- □ There is a dedicated section for relevant skills (incl foreign languages) and if applicable, interests.





## **Checklist Exercise: Content**

## CONTENT

- □ You have listed relevant clinical rotations (providing specific unit names that reflect the area of medicine not the floor name known within the hospital) as well as any other relevant coursework.
- □ You begin all phrases with precise, active resume verbs and omit passive or vague phrasing
- ☐ When applicable, you have indicated results or impact from your work in a way that aligns with the specific unit/floor of interest
- ☐ You along with a friend, family member, or someone else have proofread for typos






# **Cover Letter: Why You're Interested**

Note what position you are applying for and what appeals to you about the hospital/facility and the position. For a more general letter of interest/application, indicate interests while communicating flexibility.


- Mission Statement/Core Values
- Recent news/projects/initiatives
- Clinical/Research specialties
- Conversation with or referral from current employee
- Previous experience with the hospital/facility





# Cover Letter Sample 1: Why you're interested: Direct Exposure


"This semester, I am conducting my senior leadership clinical at Pennsylvania Hospital, in the HIV Oncology Program, where I have been able to see firsthand the excellent quality of patient care, the cooperative multi-disciplinary approach, and progressive techniques that are trademarks of Pennsylvania Hospital. In particular, the synergy and empathy that I have witnessed in team meetings have left quite an impression on me."





# Cover Letter Sample 2: Why you're interested: Referral


"I am writing to introduce myself to you at the suggestion of Dr. Howard Patterson, who is a longtime family friend. As a newcomer to Atlanta, I have heard a great deal about the high quality of nursing care at Emory University Hospital. My goal is to enhance my medical/surgical background in a university affiliated hospital, and eventually to work in a surgical step-down unit. Therefore, I would like to be considered for any available positions at Emory University Hospital."





# Cover Letter Sample 3: Why you're interested: Specifics about Hospital (Mission, Core Values, Specialties, Approach)

"I feel certain the Center Hospital's community-based maternity department, with its focus on holistic, individualized and culturally responsive care for childbearing women throughout pregnancy and delivery, will be a great place to utilize and expand my nursing and teaching skills."






## Cover Letter: How You're Qualified as a Clinician

Highlight your clinical experience and skills.


- Make a connection between your experience and the responsibilities listed in the job description.
- Pick 1 or 2 experiences that are most related to the position.
- Focus on accomplishments and impact made.





# Cover Letter Sample 4: How you're qualified as a clinician


"I have had clinical rotations in a variety of hospital and non-hospital settings. My Senior Leadership Experience provided a particularly intensive involvement in the surgical step-down unit of the Hospital of the University of Pennsylvania, and my nurse externship at Yale-New Haven Hospital last summer also afforded me exposure to a similar unit, with the added opportunity to participate in various procedures in the surgical ICU."





# Cover Letter Sample 5: How you're qualified as a clinician

"For the past year, I have also volunteered at a home health agency, which has been a rewarding and challenging experience, and has helped me to develop my skills in working with patients recovering at home from surgical procedures."






# Cover Letter: How You're Qualified in Other Ways

- Previous work experience






# Cover Letter Sample 6: How you're qualified in other ways (Other Relevant Skills)

"In addition to my nursing skills, I bring strong leadership and organizational skills gained through my extra-curricular involvement. Balancing course work, clinical experiences, and a work study job at Penn's Student Health Office with my leadership position in Student Nurses at Penn has required commitment, time management and, often, a sense of humor.


Preceptors, advisors, and supervisors have commented on my ability to manage multiple tasks simultaneously while maintaining a level of enthusiasm for the project at hand."





# Cover Letter Sample 7: How you're qualified in other ways (Other relevant experience)

"As you will see from my resume, the earliest building blocks of my nursing career, even before completing nursing school, have their foundation in women's health. My work with expectant mothers as a research assistant, my years as a reproductive health counselor and educator, and my recent community health internship with Planned Parenthood have allowed me to focus my energies on the care of women and families, which is what drew me to nursing."

- Jot down why you are interested and qualified.






# **Cover Letter: Next Steps**

Conclude your letter by:

- Thanking the reader for his/her time
- Noting your availability for an interview in order to discuss your interest and qualifications further
- Providing your contact information





# **Moving Forward**

- Draft or update your resume.
- Brainstorm stories from your relevant experience of when you were the most *energized*, *fulfilled* and *impactful*.
- Find a position (job/internship) of interest, write a cover letter for it, referring to the stories you brainstormed that connect best with the position.
- Have your resume and cover letter reviewed by a career advisor. Appointments can be scheduled via <u>Handshake</u>.
