Methodology

Career Services at the University of Pennsylvania annually surveys graduating students to provide a snapshot of their post-graduation plans.

This report looks at the 602 The Wharton School undergraduates who received their degrees from August 2022–May 2023. Students were surveyed up to six months from their graduation date, with a 68% response rate. Additional information was collected via LinkedIn and other sources, bringing the total **knowledge rate** up to **86%**, a total of 517 known graduate outcomes.



Known Outcomes 517 responses











Employment by Job Function




International Students

Of the 118 respondents working full-time who identified as foreign nationals, 93 (79%) were employed in the U.S.



Most Impactful Strategy Leading to Offer



The primary method for obtaining the full-time employment offer that graduates accepted.

29% heard about the opportunity through word of mouth (from a connection at or outside of Penn.)

13% accepted return offers from a summer internship/previous employer, primarily in the **Financial Services** industry.

12% accepted offers from **On Campus Interviews** (through a summer internship/previous employer obtained via On Campus Interviews or through On Campus Interviews directly.)


