
Accounting Major Map

TOP 5 REASONS TO CONSIDER A SPRING SEMESTER ACCOUNTING INTERNSHIP:

- 1. Fully immerse yourself in the company culture! Spending more time in the office allows you to make deeper connections to the staff and get a wholistic picture of being an accountant.
- 2. Score a full-time job offer before your senior year! If you do a great job, the firm could extend you an offer to work for them full time after your graduation.
- 3. Learn more! During the busy season, you will be exposed to more projects than summer interns.
- 4. Set yourself apart! Less students take advantage of spring internships, so you can showcase your dedication and work ethic above and beyond other students.
- 5. Receive competitive pay! Firms pay their interns well and interns are eligible for overtime pay.
