Grow Your Network & Develop Post-Grad Plans

- Meet with your SHU professors and your academic advisor to build meaningful relationships and ask questions to learn more about career options
- Attend events hosted by the <u>Career Center</u> including employer information session and/or Career Fairs. Research the attending organizations
- Continue connecting with alumni and employers to learn about application processes and hiring needs within your field(s) of interest

Internship Opportunities

- Meet with your career coach to learn about how to search for, and apply to, fall/spring/summer internships and post-grad leadership programs
- Utilize Handshake, LinkedIn, and other search engines to look for internships

Graduate School

- If you are applying to graduate school, talk with your career coach to learn the timelines for standardized tests; how to ask for effective recommendations and write effective resumes, statements of purpose, or personal statements; and the strategies for successful applications
